## Looking Back at Our History



**2014** AIDS Care Service (ACS) celebrates 20 years of services and programs, with the inaugural flagship, Holly Haven, providing 15 years of care for over 200 residents.



**2013** New logo and slogan are announced on World Aids Day in the *Winston-Salem Journal* and *The Chronicle*, supported by over 100 friends of ACS. New awareness materials remind the community that people living with HIV can still "tHrIve" and "acHieVe" a fulfilling life. The community fundraiser, Dining with Friends, is revived and returned to its former success.



**2012** "I have worn the red ribbon of ACS over my heart for many years and am exceedingly proud of what and who this agency represents. The clients have emerged to be advocates and leaders themselves, keeping us focused on excellence." – Katherine Foster upon passing the leadership torch to Jesse Duncan, current ACS Executive Director



**2011** "20 years ago, a group of very concerned citizens huddled in the basement of Knollwood Baptist Church and little did they know how many lives they would impact in the future" Kevin Mundy, V.P. of Development, discussing the formation of AIDS Care Service. ACS participates in the first Winston-Salem Pride Parade.



**2010** ACS mourns the passing of its patron saint, Sister Dennis Eileen. The first Red Ribbon Runway is held with celebrity guest judge Jack Mackenroth from Project Runway. Katherine Foster assumes the leadership role as President, completing the consolidation of ACS locations to provide "one-stop shopping" for client services.



**2009** Despite the nation suffering from an economical recession, ACS maintains programs and services for clients. Pfizer loans two Marketing and Management leaders to ACS in their new Global Health Fellows Initiative.



**2008** Photography by Jay Sinclair is exhibited throughout the community, titled Facing HIV: Portraits of Heartache, Healing and Hope. James Grissom, community educator, ACS advocate and a longtime HIV survivor, passes away.



**2007** Olympic medalist, Joey Cheek endorses "I Said Red" fundraiser and appears on invitations. Prevention for Positives becomes a new focus with a three year grant provided by the Pfizer Foundation. In recognition of the fight against HIV/AIDS, ACS receives a World AIDS Day Appreciation Award from the NC DHHS.



**2006** After 7 years of operation, Holly Haven welcomes its 100th resident. HIV Case Management for Latinos begins. The board transforms and approves a new strategic plan and the current agency mission.



**2005** Executive Director Larry Roth retires after 12 years of service, succeeded by Christine Jolly, and the new flame logo for ACS is developed. The unique exhibit, Photovoice, shares life with HIV through the disposable camera lens of ACS clients.



**2004** Although the Food Pantry, which provided critical nutrition, was threatened many times since being established in 1996 by AIDS Task Force, agencies such as Neighbors in Ministry and HOPE were determined to keep the service operating until finding its permanent home with ACS. Once serving 135 individuals, it now serves almost 200 households monthly. AMiGOS begins providing Latino peer education.



**2003** In its fourth year of operation, Holly Haven welcomed its 50th resident. The first "I said Red!" fundraising parties were held with a mission shift to help persons living with HIV "improve their quality of life" in response to more effective medications. Programs included Housing & Outreach, Latino Outreach, Day Activities, Holly Haven, and the new independent living course, Back to Basics.



**2002** First Spanish speaking services are offered by new Coordinator, providing outreach to the Latino community. ACS acquires the "Horseshoe" building and begins renovation to provide transitional housing for the homeless. The 10th annual community event, Dining for Friends, raises over \$43,000. Faith In Action is awarded and recognized to engage volunteers from faith communities.

**2001** Trustee David Piner stunned Sister Dennis Eileen with a surprise dedication for her devotion to the comfort and spiritual strength of people living with AIDS. The new 1st Street home, suggested by Housing Coordinator Cheryl Kiser, will be called "Grace House" which calls to mind the grace of Sister Dennis in ministering to others.



**2000** Catastrophe hits the "Blue House", the first home for ACS services. A wall of water from a heavy rainstorm collapses a section declaring it unsafe. Services displaced at the time included Day Activities, Housing Coordination, Outreach and four transitional housing units. Special gifts from the Kate B. Reynolds Charitable Trust, United Way, Home Moravian Church, and the Adam Foundation aided in relocation expenses.

**1999** The name "Holly Haven" is announced during the opening dedication. Led by Director Larry Roth, more than \$500,000 was raised to complete the Family Care Home through the generosity of The Kate B. Reynolds Charitable Trust, Winston-Salem Foundation, RJR III & Marie M. Reynolds Foundation, James G. Hanes Memorial Fund, the Sara Lee Corporation, and countless community donations.

**1998** Ground breaking and construction for the six-bed Family Care Home. "This is not a house of death, but a house of transition. Some people will come here and get better through the care, warmth and laughter." Dr. Kevin High, Bowman Gray School of Medicine, Board Member. Founding Board President, Kitty Bowman, will pass later that year.



**1997** Founding Trustees, Dr. Thomas Austin and Charlotte Cundiff, pass away. Robert Cundiff, Charlotte's husband, will later establish an endowment for the family care home in memorial to their son, Selden, who died of AIDS. "Life is lived not in years, but in moments of love, moments of caring, moments of discovery." Dr. Thomas Austin

**1996** Strategic plan for end-stage family care home takes shape and raises funds to secure a site and fund operations.

**1995** ACS begins several long-standing relationships including the Adam Foundation, Kate B. Reynolds Charitable Trust, the City of Winston-Salem Housing & Neighborhood Development Department, Knollwood Baptist Church, Centenary United Methodist Church, the Congregational HIV/AIDS Interfaith Network (CHAIN), and many engaged community members.

**1994** ACS becomes operational, focusing on housing to complement services provided by the AIDS Task Force. The first service, Day Activities, provided a healthy hot lunch with education and support to those suffering from AIDS. The board and board president Kitty Bowman begin planning a model 6-bed end stage care facility.

**1991** Aids Care Service (ACS) is incorporated by community members wanting to act compassionately against the painful, stigmatizing death inevitable at the time. Their mission -- "To provide housing for our brothers & sisters living with HIV disease."

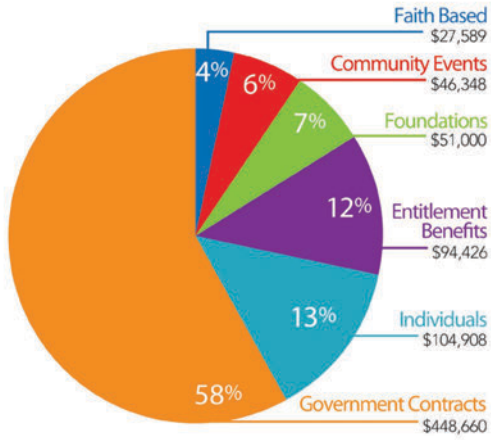

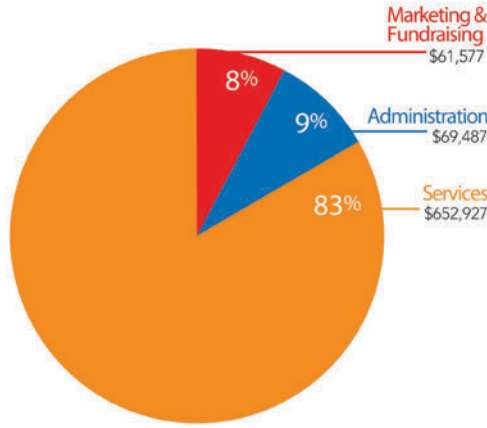

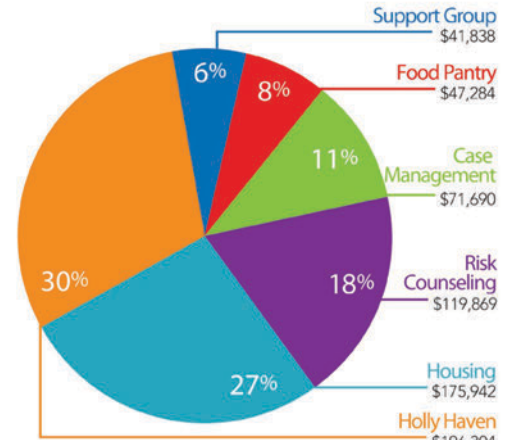

**Cost of Operations** \$783,991

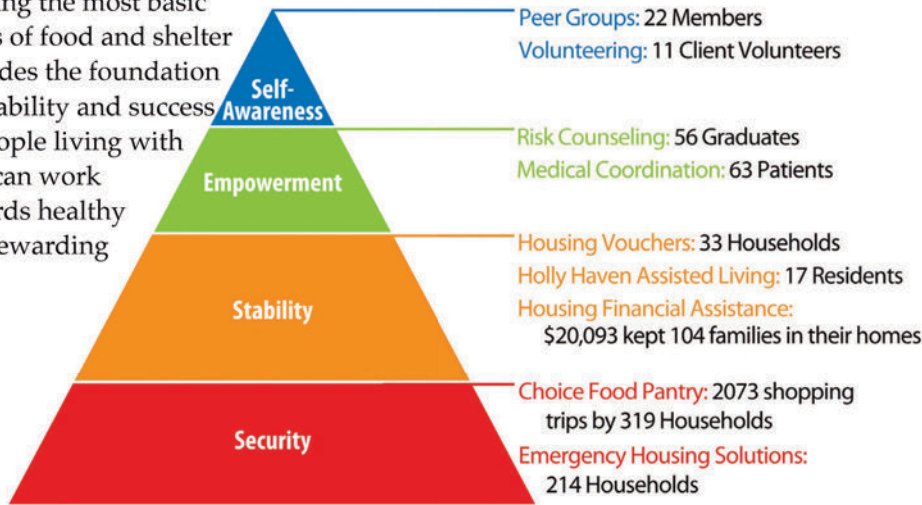
